In December 2005 a story of a net-entangled whale appeared in the San Francisco Chronicle. It's a story about a female humpback whale that had become entangled in a spider web of crab traps and lines. She also had hundreds of yards of line rope wrapped around her body, her tail, her torso, and a line tugging in her mouth.

DFAS PASSWORD POLICY CHALLENGED

The Defense Finance and Accounting Services (DFAS) announced earlier this summer that it would implement a new password security system for its myPay online pay program. The new password must:

be 15 to 30 characters in length

contain at least two UPPERČASE letters (A-Z)

contain at least two lowercase letters(a-z)

contain at least two numbers (0-9)

contain at least two of the following special characters: $\# @ \$^{+} = \%$

change at least four characters from the previous password.

Additionally, passwords must be changed every 60 days.

MOAA heard from many members that this new password process was far too complicated, and the 60 day window too short.

In response, MOAA President Vice Adm. Norb Ryan wrote Theresa McKay, Director of DFAS to raise the concern. We've asked DFAS to consider reviewing its new requirements to ensure that myPay remains both secure and user friendly. The new requirements threaten to disenfranchise beneficiaries from using this important financial resource.
