



Federal Legislation from summer AIA, MOAA recently sent emails to legislative Representatives requesting their support of three Bills. 1) Major Richard Starr Act 2) Tricare Access to Care Act 3) Military Spouse Hiring Act, supported by several NC Representatives. However, Senators Tillis and Bud have not supported them yet. If you can contact Tillis and Bud please ask them to support these very important Bills for our military and dependents.

At State Legislation, there have been two bills signed into law so far that impact the veteran community. The first one HB91 or now SL2025-20 which recognizes Space Force as an official Military service branch, established on Dec.20,2019, and is effective as of 6/26/2025. The second bill is SB118 or now SL2025-72. The bill is 8 pages in length and includes a lot of different components and nuances. The major topics include reducing concealed handgun fees for certain Veterans, provides additional time for military families to provide proof of residency for public school enrollment, prohibits discriminatory admission policies regarding active-duty service members and veterans require military admissions deferment for certain persons admitted to the UNC system and provide in-state tuition to certain honorably discharged veterans. It also regulates compensation for services related to veterans' benefits matters, authorize remote driver's license renewals for active-duty military and their families. It provides children of wartime veterans scholarship funds award flexibility and authorizes sheriffs to send permit expiration notices via email. They are still working to learn more information on the study being worked (HB432) on property taxes and the other bills that made the crossover list and are being worked in various committees.

Our BOD recently authorized a Membership Committee; we sent emails to those we thought may like to be Chapter Members and asked them to send back their application. If you have received our email, please return your application. We assure you that you will enjoy our chapter. We have been a 5-star chapter for the past 12 years. We plan to send emails for another 3 months in September. However, if you know a friend or neighbor that would like to join our MOAA family please let us know at 1vp@cfmoaa.org. Everyone is a recruiter in MOAA and we look forward to hearing from you. On a personal note, I was recently honored by the CG XVIII Corps, who appointed me as a "Airborne Ambassador". I have a special jacket For all Fort Bragg events. During one event I had the opportunity to talk with NC Secretary of Military and Veterans Affairs, Jocelyn Mallette who was the CG guest speaker. I invited her to be our guest speaker for our annual meeting on 15 NOV 25. She graciously accepted. I hope everyone enjoys the rest of summer.

The biblical story of Esther is a timeless reminder of the power of stepping up when it matters most. Faced with danger and uncertainty, Esther chose courage over comfort—action over silence. 

In the Book of Esther, both Esther and her cousin Mordecai faced a crisis. The Jewish people were in danger, and Esther, as queen, had a unique opportunity to intervene. Mordecai urged her to speak to the king, even though doing so could cost her life. His words still resonate: "For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?" — Esther 4:14. Esther made her choice—and changed history.

This story brings to mind a humorous analogy. A chicken says to a pig, "Let's make a ham and egg breakfast for the farmer. He's been so good to us—it would be a nice gesture." The pig replies, "That's easy for you to say. For you, it's just a contribution. For me, it's the ultimate sacrifice." Service often asks more of us than we expect. Sometimes it's a contribution. Other times, it's a sacrifice. But in every case, it's a choice to get involved.

So, what will your choice be? Will you speak up, step in, and serve—especially when it counts? There are several ways we need your involvement. Immediate need: Help is needed for the upcoming golf fundraiser—"all hands on deck." Involvement means someone cares. When a person cares they work past their objections. They trust God to help them overcome their fears and do something to make an impact. Jim Elliott's quote has always inspired me: "Only one life, will soon be passed. Edmund Burke also said, "Nobody made a greater mistake than he who did nothing because he could do only a little."

"CHEDDAR UP" - What Is It?

Cheddar Up is a commercially available online system designed to assist organizations such as PTA's, Scouts, non-profits, etc., to collect money and information.

MOAA partnered with Cheddar Up to provide the necessary tools to MOAA chapters to collect dues and donations by offering their members the option to pay online using a credit card. The system has other features such as collecting for meeting meals among others.

MOAA has made enrollment in Cheddar Up optional to its affiliates at no expense to them - MOAA national picks up all subscription and transaction fees. Monies collected by chapters through Cheddar Up are electronically transferred and deposited directly to chapter bank accounts.

The Cape Fear Chapter enrolled in January 2025, and we began collecting membership dues and donations for the scholarship fund using the system.

In February 2025 we introduced Cheddar Up to collect for meals and RSVP for our chapter meetings and events. By using this option to pay, the member automatically RSVP's and there is no need to mail in a reservations form. This saves you time, paper, check, envelope and postage stamp and, as a bonus, you profit from earning the reward points on your credit card.

The option to pay by check is still available, however, you must still complete and mail in a reservations form and check.

Finally, we have implemented yet another Cheddar Up feature to streamline the collection of sponsorships, donations and individual/team player registration for our annual fundraising golf tournament. You can sponsor a hole, sponsor a soldier, make a donation, and/or register to play or any combination thereof in one transaction and charge the total to your credit card.

How do you access Cheddar Up? By clicking on the link provided on our website post for the event or by scanning the QR code provided on the event flier or program.

<u>ANNUAL GOLF TOURNAMENT</u> <u>September 20, 2025</u>

Our annual fundraising golf tournament will be held at Gates Four Golf & Country Club on Saturday, 20 September 2025. Registration will commence at 11:00 AM, a lunch buffet will be served at 11:30 AM, and players will tee off at 1:00 PM. In keeping with tradition, we will invite 50-60 activeduty soldiers/airmen as our guests to enjoy a great day of golf, food and drink, and camaraderie.

We encourage all our members to take part in this annual event either as a sponsor, a donor, a player, or a combination thereof. Here is how you can:

Hole Sponsorships. A donation of \$150 will sponsor a golf hole. You can sponsor a hole in your name, or in memory of a loved one. If you know of any business, civic or church group, or friend that would be willing to support a noble program ask them to sponsor a hole. Sponsorship entitles the sponsor to a professionally fabricated sign with the inscription, "This Hole Sponsored by", followed by the sponsor's name and/or other designation, prominently displayed on one of the tee boxes during the tournament. The names of all sponsors are widely publicized in all tournament literature and our website.

Active-Duty Soldiers Sponsorships. Our program to sponsor our active-duty soldiers and airmen to play in our golf tournament as our guests is a popular one. Our soldiers have a great time and our sponsors get a great sense of satisfaction in treating them. Our goal this year is to sponsor at least 60 active-duty soldiers; the cost will be \$85 per soldier (the player entry fee). The benefits of this program are several but suffice it to say that they present us with an opportunity to thank our active-duty soldiers for their service by treating them to a great golf outing; and it presents them an opportunity to interact with their retired comrades.

To sponsor a hole and/or a soldier or simply donate you can use the sponsorship submission form and mail it in as indicated in the form together with your check.

A second option this year is to submit your contributions online and charge the total to a credit card by scanning the QR code on the form or the tournament flier.
