
Trees

"CHEDDAR UP" - What Is It?

Cheddar Up is a commercially available online system designed to assist organizations such as PTA's, Scouts, non-profits, etc., to collect money and information.

MOAA partnered with Cheddar Up to provide the necessary tools to MOAA chapters to collect dues and donations by offering their members the option to pay online using a credit card. The system has other features such as collecting for meeting meals among others.

MOAA has made enrollment in Cheddar Up optional to its affiliates at no expense to them - MOAA national picks up all subscription and transaction fees. Monies collected by chapters through Cheddar Up are electronically transferred and deposited directly to chapter bank accounts.

The Cape Fear Chapter enrolled in January 2025, and we began collecting membership dues and donations for the scholarship fund using the system.

In February 2025 we introduced Cheddar Up to collect for meals and RSVP for our chapter meetings and events. By using this option to pay, the member automatically RSVP's and there is no need to mail in a reservations form. This saves you time, paper, check, envelope and postage stamp and, as a bonus, you profit from earning the reward points on your credit card.

The option to pay by check is still available, however, you must still complete and mail in a reservations form and check.

Finally, we have implemented yet another Cheddar Up feature to streamline the collection of sponsorships, donations and individual/team player registration for our annual fundraising golf tournament. You can sponsor a hole, sponsor a soldier, make a donation, and/or register to play or any combination thereof in one transaction and charge the total to your credit card.

How do you access Cheddar Up? By clicking on the link provided on our website post for the event or by scanning the QR code provided on the event flier or program.

On **November 8, 2025** at the annual **North Carolina Council of Chapters**' business meeting, the NCCOC will be voting to fill the President's', three Vice Presidents' and potentially a fourth Vice president's position depending on the wishes of the Council. Below are position requirements:

President:

- Matthe The NCCOC President serves as the chief executive officer and official representative of the Council.
- 🛮 Presides at all Council and Executive Committee meetings.
- Appoints standing and special committees, subject to the approval of the Council.
- 🛮 Acts as an ex-officio member of all committees with voting rights on all except the Nominations Committee.
- □ Confers with the Secretary regarding contents of notices of meetings, meeting agendas, and distribution of minutes
- ☑ Confers with other officers and chairs regarding their respective duties.
- ☑ Be familiar with the NCCOC Bylaws, "Council and Chapter Policies and Procedures Guide", and the "National MOAA Strategic Plan".
- Must be a National MOAA member.

Vice-President/ Membership:

- ☐ Chairs the Membership Committee.
- ☑ Oversees the committee efforts to retain existing members and recruit new ones.
- Maintains the Council CM with National MOAA.
- ☐ Ensures all Council and chapter officers are National MOAA members.
- ☑ Coordinates with chapters to ensure upkeep of chapter's, the CM, Committee Module. The VP,
- Membership must be able to teach classes on the CM.
- Maintains records on chapter growth, losses, and retention using the CM.
- Maintains the status of chapters health
- ☑ Be familiar with the NCCOC Bylaws, Council and Chapter Policies and Procedures Guide", and National MOAA "Strategic Plan."
- Must be a National MOAA member.

Vice-President/ Federal Advocacy in Action:

- □ Chairs the Federal Advocacy Committee
- ☐ Ensures a designated chapter legislative chair or liaison is assigned to each U.S. congressional district and both senators are contacted as needed.
- ☐ Ensures representation is sent to Washington for the annual AiA.
- ☐ Creates and executes an annual legislative plan in coordination with National MOAA
- ☑ Be familiar with the NCCOC Bylaws, " Council and Chapter Policies and Procedures Guide", and National MOAA "Strategic Plan".
- Must be a National MOAA member.

Vice-President/ N.C. State Advocacy in Action:

- ☑ Executive advocacy-related tasks as directed by the Council.
- □ Chairs the State Advocacy Committee.
- ☐ Ensures a designated chapter legislative chair or liaison is assigned to each 170 General assembly
- members and state senators are contacted as needed and to reach aguot; green guot; status on the DSLO map.
- ☑ Ensures representation is sent to Raleigh on a as needed basis.
- 🛮 Creates and executes an annual legislative plan and coordinates with the NC Veterans Committee.
- ☑ Be familiar with the NCCOC Bylaws, " Council and Chapter Policies and Procedures Guide & quot;, and national MOAA Strategic Plan".
- Must be a national MOAA member.

North Carolina Council of Chapters (cont'd)

Assistant Vice-President/Transition and Career (reporting to VP Membership):

This position is subject to the approval of the Council

- 🛮 Oversees the committee efforts to recruit officers transitioning from active duty to civilian careers.
- ☑ Creates an annual Transiting plan to include a directory of Transition offices at each military facility.
- 🛮 Coordinates with the chapter membership chair on establishing a Transition plan.
- ☑ Contacts military Transition offices to provide information on MOAA Transition and Careers
- Assist in maintaining records on chapter growth, losses, and retention.
- 🛮 Be familiar with the NCCOC Bylaws, Council and Chapter Policies and Procedures Guide", and National MOAA "Strategic Plan."
- Must be a National MOAA member.

Vice-Presidents' additional duties as determined by the Council president.

- Assist the President when called upon.
- Stay informed about the health of member chapters along with the Council president.
- Mark Performs the duties of the President in the event of temporary disability or absence of the President
- Equot; Former chapter officers and chapter delegates are well suited for council leadership positions; chapter delegates should not simultaneously serve as elected officials on the council. Equot;

THE BYLAWS OF NORTH CAROLINA STATE COUNCIL OF CHAPTERS, LLC, MOAA, ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS, Section 1. determines how often an election is held. Human Reflection

"The Root" - A Soldier's Perspective by "Hal" Thacker

In late October 1983, a nineteen year old U.S. Army Private First Class (PFC), fresh out of Advanced Individual Training (AIT) and stationed at Fort Sill, Oklahoma was now enroute with thirty-two fellow Soldiers to what the Marines called "The Root" which was the nickname for Beruit, Lebanon.

I was accustomed to Officers. NonCommissioned Officers, and Enlisted in the U.S. Army but now integrated with Marines and Sailors, there were "rules" new to me such as "Cinderella Liberty", a Marine PFC is an E-2 not an E-3, different mess decks for different ranks, etc.

As I reflect back over forty years back, this was the best "education" that I could have been given as a young Soldier beginning my career because I was able to spend time with a platoon of Marine Infantry in "The Root", and while on laundry detail on the USS Guam learned quite a bit about a Sailor's life.

On that fateful day, I lost two AIT instructors that were some of the best trainers that the Field Artillery School has ever produced. and I am very thank you that each of them poured into me what they knew about the military specialty that I had entered into.

So, i ask that each of you that read this, please take a "moment of silence" on 23 October for those that survived but also for the loved ones that their servicemember did not leave "The Root" the same way that they entered it.
